
TRANSFORMATIONAL DEVELOPMENTS



Bedrock is actively working on four transformational projects in Detroit that include the redevelopment of the historic Hudson's Site, development of Monroe Blocks, restoration of Book Tower, and expansion of One Campus Martius. Together, these four projects will add 3.2 million square feet of office, residential, retail, hospitality and event space to the market.
